A study conducted in California demonstrated a difference in the survival of people over an 18-year period for people with various levels of family income [Hochshtim (1970)]. Higher socio-economic status ws associated with higher rates of survival. D.R. Williams (1999) observed in his study that there were higher disease rates for blacks (or African Americans) compared to whites are pervasive and persistent over time.





Respondents who had heart diseases and hypertension were the highest with 20% each followed by those with eye sight defects and stress with 15% each. Respondents who had back pain, piles and respiratory problems were the least with 10% each. (Table 5.2 and Figure 5.2)

6. CONCLUSION:

Bus conductors happen to be among one of the lower strata in terms of salary paid among government employees. They are paid a few grades higher than sanitary workers working for the respective corporations. Despite having not provisions for having higher grade pay like the regular bus conductors working in metro cities, the health issues faced by the town bus conductors are similar. The current research study was envisioned to look into the health issues faced by town bus conductors in Salem district. The study revealed that a majority of the conductors had heart diseases and hypertension apart from other types of illness such as eye sight defects, stress, back pain etc.

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
