During this field research, the researchers studied many academic articles and journals related to this topic and try to figure out the effective approaches and strategies on developing students' problem in learning short stories. In this study the questionnaire method was used and data were collected from 50 students, English Department, Balkh University. As a results, this mini research suggest the following useful strategies and approaches such as, reading practice, writing short pieces of dairy, and childhood memories would help students to learn short stories and becoming a good reader.

1. INTRODUCTION:

4. ANALYSIS AND DISCUSSION:

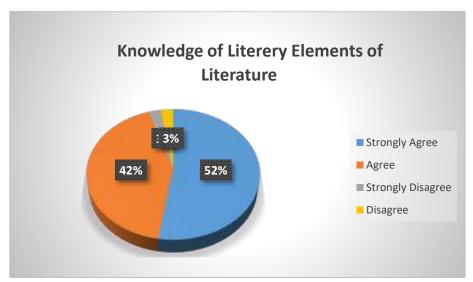


Figure 1: Knowledge of Literary Elements of Literature

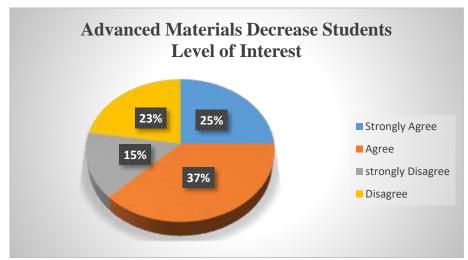


Figure 2: Advanced Materials Decrease Students Level of Interest

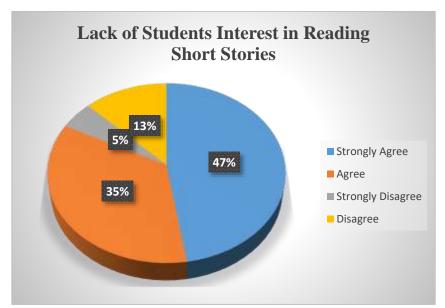


Figure 4: Lack of Students Interest in Reading Short Stories

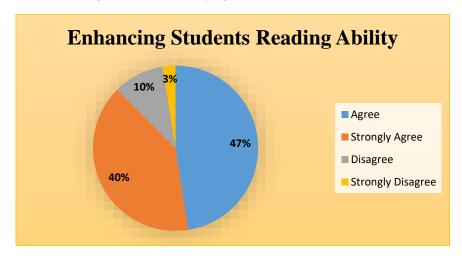


Figure 6: Enhancing Students Reading Ability

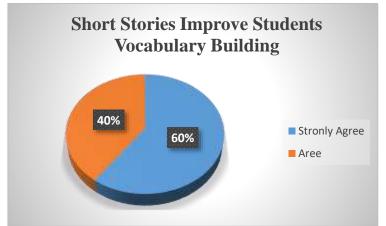


Figure 8: Short Stories Improve Students' Vocabulary Building

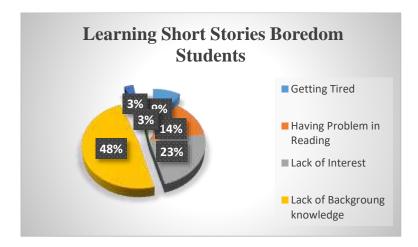


Figure 9: Learning Short Stories Boredom Students
