The sample for this study were 80 student teachers and 5 principals belonging to collaborative schools. Three-point likert scale and in-depth interviews were used for data collection. Jogan, Dr. S.N. The results expound that the student teachers have successfully developed integrated skills of teaching and this became possible through effective guidance and feedback. The student teachers were extremely satiated throughout the program.

Lobo, Joseph. (2023) in the study on "An inquiry on the effectiveness of the teaching internship program based on pre-service teachers' appraisal' discussed that internship is a vital facet of professional development of teacher education. The aim of this study was to analyze the implementation of the program of the Institution of Education, Arts and Sciences at City College of Angeles, particularly, learners of Bachelor of Physical Education and Bachelor of Performing Arts. This study also analyzed the influence of Institutional (IE) and Company Evaluation (CE) on Program Effectiveness (PE). 84 student teachers were chosen as the sample which comprised of 38 males 46 females. The student teachers found the program to be quite effective as it caters to the needs of the stakeholders. It also aids the student teachers in developing requisite skills. At last, the paper delineated the recommendations and a path for further research in relation to this study.




Research Objective: To analyse the effectiveness of school internship program in enhancing the pedagogical skills of the student teachers.

To achieve the research objective the students were asked the following research questions:


Research Question 1: Were you able to implement the learnings attained from the B.Ed program during your school internship?

Research Question 2: Did simulated teaching prove to be an effective method in improving your pedagogical skills?




According to Figure 2, 45.2% student teachers state that simulated teachings proved to be an effective method in improving their pedagogical skills.




According to Figure 3, 54.8% student teachers believe that designing of lesson plans as a part of the B.Ed program aided during the school internship.

Research Question 5: Did designing teaching aids during you B.Ed program help you during your internship?




According to Figure 5, 35.5% student teachers believed that designing teaching aids during the B.Ed program helped them during their internship.




Research Question 6: Did the faculty feedback provided during the internship aided in enriching your classroom teaching?




According to Figure 6, 48.4% student teachers opined that the faculty feedback provided during the internship aided in enriching their classroom teaching.

Research Question 8: Were you able to master the management skills during the school internship?




According to Figure 8, 41.9% student teachers were able to master the management skills during the school internship.




Research Question 9: Were you able to master the communication skills during the school internship?
